Englizh

This term's English focus is "Sustainability". Both reading and writing units are linked to Science – Life Cycles. In writing, students will be highlighting this focus in a persuasive text

on the importance of green sea turtles. Students will listen to a novel – "Chelonia Green – Champion of Turtles."

Mathr

Year 3

Students will focus on the following concepts this term;

Number – recognise, represent and order numbers beyond 10 000; extend and apply knowledge of addition and subtraction facts; add and subtract 2 and 3-digit numbers by partitioning, rearranging and regrouping numbers; represent and recall 2s, 5s, 10s multiplication facts and related division facts; model and solve practical problems using a variety of strategies.

Time – estimate, measure and compare duration of events using seconds, minutes and hours; read and write time to the nearest minute on analogue and digital clocks

Year 2

Students will focus on the following concepts this term;

Number – count in 2s, 3s, 5s and 10s and identify and continue number patterns; read, write and represent numbers to 1000; recall addition and subtraction facts to 20; add strings of 1-digit numbers efficiently; add and subtract 2-digit numbers using a variety of strategies; represent and solve simple addition and subtraction word problems.

Time – order months of the year and seasons; read and interpret calendars; read and write time (o'clock/half past/quarter past/quarter to) on analogue and digital clocks.

Science

This term students will investigate characteristics of living things to enable them to classify objects as living, non-living or once living and explain their reasoning. Students will further study types of living things; animal groups and plants. They will observe and represent lifecycles of living things, detail stages of development and compare life cycles of an animal that goes through metamorphosis (frogs) and an animal that does not go through metamorphosis (sea turtles). We also hope to connect with Mackay and District Turtle Watch sometime this term so if any of our families are part of this group, we would love to hear from you!

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Humanities and Social Sciences (HASS) EXPLORING PLACES NEAR AND FAR (BOTH TERM 1 AND TERM 2)

In this unit for Term 2 students will continue to explore the inquiry question: *How and why are places similar and different?*

In this unit, students will:

- Identify the direction of the Philippines from Australia
- Identify the similarities and differences in relation to: climate, geographical features, culture, wildlife

Derign Technology

Over the semester, students will research traditional shelters in the Philippines called Nipa Huts. They will then design and construct their own model of a Nipa Hut. Students will need to consider weather, materials and climate when designing their huts.

Digital Technology

Not studied this semester.

Media

Over the semester, students will create a media artwork that contains an image, text and audio using computer software. This will be linked to their Science unit from term 1 and will focus around instruments.

Vizual Art

Not studied this semester.

Music/Dance/Drama – Miss Kay

2/3C

In Drama this term students will continue to explore creating characters through improvisations and learning to accept other's ideas and build on these ideas. In Music students will follow agreed decisions about how the music should sound, they will also make decisions about how/where to sit/stand in a performance space. Students will also contribute to post-performance discussions in sharing what went well in the performance.

3A

In Drama this term students will reflect on live and recorded drama performances examining what the purpose of the drama is and formulating opinions on why they think people from diverse cultures create dramas for similar purposes. In Music students will combine composed and improvised sections to create a complete work, they will introduce their composition sharing their intended purpose for the piece.

P.E. and Health

2/3C

This term, students will apply fundamental movement skills and demonstrate movement concepts across a range of situations so they can participate in the whole school athletics carnival. Students will adapt movement strategies to enhance movement outcomes during activities and at the athletics carnival. It is fundamental for students to wear a hat and bring a water bottle to PE to ensure they can stay sun safe, hydrated and in the learning space at all times. As part of the Health unit, students will be learning to understand the importance of and how to respond positively and be resilient in difficult situations, for example: isolation, bullying, and harassment. Students will be provided various scenarios and expected to respond orally within a peer group to show resilience and positive responses.
